Although they are probably going to fall a little short of their \$235,000 goal, they achieved 92% of that goal by bringing in \$216,000 this year. What a great way to kick off the over all effort!

I really enjoyed and was honored to be the campaign chairman this year. Tom and Jennifer were great to work with and do an amazing job for the United Way and this community. They deserve our thanks. It is always inspiring to see a community come together and support a worthy cause like the United Way.

We decided that we would forgo the campaign video and cut the print advertising in order to meet our goal of \$645,000. Agencies were asked to step up with their best testimonials and help with company campaigns. Everyone worked together in a positive mode; many companies added that extra touch in order to meet their goals. There is no way possible that we can thank all of the volunteers, company CEO's, donors for all the help that they provided.

K.C. DeBoer, never flinched when asked to serve as campaign chair. He knew it would be a challenging year but took hold of the reins and helped us with campaign presentations, encouragement and humor. We can't thank him enough for all that he has done to make us successful. Joe Senger, Charlie Jakober and Brad Moore Co-Chaired the Rails Club and help to bring in 18 new Rails Club members and help raise approximately \$220,000. Thanks also to the dedicated 62 men and women who gave their precious time to reach the Rails Club goal. Aaron Shultz sacrificed a lot this year but was always there when we needed him. He did an excellent job in providing leadership as President.

Other projects that continued to be strong were NSU's "Day of Champions", NALC food drive, Presentation College's "Day of Caring" and Christmas Eve at Avera St. Lukes.

**Safe Harbor** ~ To assist women, children, and men during crisis situations and to provide resources for making positive life choices. *Programs: Visitation Center "Kids Konnection" and Crisis Intervention.*

**The Salvation Army** ~ To preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination. *Programs: Material Economic Assistance; Area Food Services; Community Center Services; and Emergency & Disaster Services.*

### Promoting Self-Sufficiency

**Lutheran Social Services** ~ To care for, support and strengthen individuals, families and communities. *Programs: Aberdeen Counseling Center, New Beginnings Center, and Consumer Credit Counseling.*

**Northeastern Mental Health Center** ~ To provide a comprehensive array of mental health services performed by qualified professionals and serving residents without regard to their ability to pay. *Programs: Community Based Services.*

**Volunteers of America** ~ A non-profit, spiritually based organization that reaches out to empower people of all ages to become healthier, self-sufficient, productive members of their communities. *Programs: Family Crisis Intervention Program.*

**Aberdeen Area Child & Adolescent Services System Program** ~ To assure that services provided to children with special needs and their families are coordinated, unified, readily accessible and holistic. *Programs: Project Ahead; Birth to 3 Tracking; and Flexible funding for Families.*

## **Community Initiatives . . .**

### **FEMA, EMERGENCY FOOD AND SHELTER PROGRAM**

The Emergency Food and Shelter Program began by Congress in 1982 to provide food and shelter services for those in need. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) determines the funding for Brown County and appropriations are based on county unemployment rates. United Way of Northeastern South Dakota acts as the coordinating agent for the program. The Executive Director is the Chair of the local governing board which is responsible for allocating funds to the applicant agencies. United Way agencies participating in the program include The Salvation Army, Safe Harbor, and Lutheran Social Services.

### **NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LETTER CARRIERS FOOD DRIVE**

The National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) food drive began nationally in 1992. Aberdeen first took part in the event in 1993. The food drive takes place the second Saturday in May. The United Way and the local NALC chapter coordinate the event. A committee made up of representatives from the NALC, United Way, and the recipients plan the details of the event. The NALC chooses the recipients of the food. The food is split between three local food banks. The Salvation Army receives half of the food and the other half is divided between Safe Harbor and Northeastern Mental Health Center's CARE program. In 2007, the food drive took place one week after unprecedented rains fell on the Aberdeen area causing a flood. The letter carriers collected 19,000 lbs. of food for the local food banks - the most food ever collected by over 5,000 lbs. The NALC food drive has helped replenish the food drives after the busy holiday season.

### **NORTHERN STATE UNIVERSITY'S DAY OF CHAMPIONS**

In August of 2002, NSU's football team held the first Day of Champions. In 2005, it was decided to move the Day of Champions to the Spring instead of the Fall to coordinate better with the football practice schedule. The United Way of Northeastern South Dakota spearheads the project finding 6 to 9 projects based on need and merit. In 2007 for the first time, the day included the entire NSU athletic department. Over 200, Northern State University athletes spend a labor intense day working for non-profits, communities, and schools contributing \$25,000 worth of labor. Without the help of the football team these projects might not get done. The organizations receiving the free labor must provide the supplies for the project. The Aberdeen Sertoma Club, Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, Subway, and Pepsi of Aberdeen helped sponsor food and drinks. The Twist Cone gave all ice cream sale proceeds for the day to help purchase materials the agency needed for the event, such as paint supplies.

### **PRESENTATION COLLEGE'S DAY OF CARING**

In 2007, Presentation College started a Day of Caring project with the incoming Freshman class. Presentation College provides close to 100 incoming freshmen and staff to do service projects for partner agencies. They take a half day during their freshman orientation to provide service to the community. United Way finds 3 to 5 service projects for the students to complete.

### **CHRISTMAS EVE AT AVERA**

Spearheaded by Executive Director, Tom Agnitsch, United Way partners with the Sertoma, Exchange, and Optimist Clubs of Aberdeen to bring joy to those in the hospital. With the help of Santa, Mrs. Clause and several singing elves Poinsettias and Toys are delivered to patients on Christmas Eve. Christmas Eve of 2009 was the 5<sup>th</sup> year the event took place.
